Our guest speaker at our February meeting was David Buck, Channel Manager Software Solutions for the Harris Corporation.

David gave us an easy to understand overview of Harris NetVX, a unique networking device that can replace up to 14 hard wired devices formerly needed to support only one type of network, with an infinitely flexible platform that can handle all packet-based architectures such as: ATM, IP, microwave and satellite. David referred to the NetVX as the "second generation Flexicoder on steroids." With NetVX, analog or digital video (SD or HD), audio, and/or data can be transported over any combination of networks simultaneously.

Most systems need to be replaced or seriously upgraded, so it is not for the "weak of budget." It is also a major change in operations because every facet of the on-air look needs to be reexamined due to the new aspect ratio and the higher resolution.

Finally, this is your professional and broadcast organization for western Pennsylvania.

## The XXth Winter Olympic Games from Turino, Italy IV

The XXth Winter Olympic games have come to an end finally, here in Torino, Italy.

NBC was able to provide over 26.5 hours of Olympic coverage with the time delay between the United States and Italy. As I talked before in my articles about the curling coverage that aired on USA network and CNBC, most of the coverage actually ended up being done live to those networks.

The "Virtual control room" had an almost flawless to-air report card. The use of the Internet to switch the router and feeds from the curling venue in Italy from the production rooms in New Jersey went well.

Using an audio sub mixer box that is made by Tieline enabled the announcers and their IFB's to be mixed via the internet from New Jersey as well. Yes, there was a small time delay to the IFB's returning from New Jersey, but we were able to have the announcers watch the return feed from New Jersey as well as their local program feed. This dual monitoring of the video signal would allow them to keep their continuity for the show.

One other Internet control that worked well was the ability to have a video shader control the cameras in Torino, Italy from his video desk in New Jersey. A small amount of reaction time delay would happen, but with this being a indoor event with constant lighting, there were no real time-delay issues.

As the Olympics end with a very positive performances by all the athletes, I finally get ready to pack up my stuff after 3 months in Italy. It's time to come home.




