Last Meeting

Eleven members and guests turned out for our first evening meeting on March 16. The start of our meeting was delayed a few minutes because Gaetanoes wasn't expecting us and they had to move us to a small meeting room.

Our guest speaker, Mr. David Russin, Sales Engineer for the Masstech Group, gave us an overview of how his company can assist broadcasters and distribution entities such as CNN and Disney continue their business in the event of a disaster.

Mr. Russin spoke about Masstech's MassDR, which will automatically monitor video servers, automation and traffic systems, and then intelligently harvest material necessary for broadcast in the next 24 hours. This material is collected and continually updated to a secure off-site location using standard network topology. In the event of an interruption in service from the main facility, playout from the remote site can be triggered using several methods.

The MassDR has the ability to record ID's, PSA's and other generic programming material that can be used to maintain a continuous play-out stream when scheduled content has not, or can not be prerecorded, such as live network feeds.
