pril is NAB month. With the exception of twice in the last 41 years, it has been my annual trek. For most of those years I was free to roam the floor, looking for things that truly changed the industry. The first practical video server in 1994 (Tektronix Profile PDR-100), the first digital video recorders (1987, Sony D-1), first MPEG encoder (1994 Divicom), first digital production switcher (1988, GVG Kadenza), first AVID editor (AVID/1, 1988), first non-linear editor (CMX600, 1970), first CCD camera (RCA CCD-1, 1984), and many other industry changing products have been food for NAB wanderers. I missed the introduction of video tape (AMPEX VR-1000, 1956).

This year very little is expected to be introduced which we will all remember as having changed the industry. Cameras will be smaller, cheaper, and better (debatable...). Storage will be faster, denser and cheaper. VTRs will be smaller and cheaper. In fact the theme, if there is one, is that manufacturers are responding to the fact that the broadcast market is tiny compared to other segments of industry. Their strategy is to leverage research into consumer products and turn them into professional products. Dolby makes more money licensing in consumer products than they do making commercial products. "Pro-sumer" crossover products are mainstream these days. Who would have thought that broadcasters would see the CES as nearly as important to their industry as NAB?"

April 30 Deadline for Board Nominations

April 30 is the deadline for being nominated to serve on the SBE National Board of Directors. Contact any member of the Nominations Committee if you are interested (Jim Bernier, jim.bernier@sbe.org; Ralph Beaver, bevo@media-alert.com; or Larry Wilkins, larry.wilkins@cumulus.com).

The SBE is governed by a 17 person board of directors and four officers. The SBE Nominations Committee is currently seeking candidates to run for six at-large board positions to run in this summer's elections. Candidates must be Regular, Senior or Life members or be the designated representative of an SBE Sustaining Member and hold an engineering level certification. Directors serve two years and are expected to attend two full meetings of the Board each year, which includes the spring meeting at NAB and the fall meeting at the SBE National Convention (here in Pittsburgh this year only). Meeting attendance is at the individuals own expense.
