FCC: 80 Percent of TV Stations Can Stay Analog

As the public is being told that all TV stations must cease analog broadcasting in February of 2009, broadcasters are reminded by the latest official FCC Broadcast Stations Totals list that it ain't so. That is, if you look at the numbers. Of the 9,087 TV stations in the country, only 1,760, or 19.4%, are full power stations required to shut down analog. The remaining 7,327, or 80.6%, are various forms of LPTV stations which don't yet have an FCC mandate to start digital broadcasting.

While admittedly most of these low power TV stations don't have the impact of full power network stations, their ERP's can range up to 150 kW, and they are just about everywhere. While you might have thought LPTV and Translator

stations are a far west, rural phenomenon, the Pittsburgh market has six centrally located LPTV's and more than a dozen more in surrounding areas serving much of the market. And that scenario is repeated all across the country.

Some LPTV's will "flash cut" to digital or add a digital companion channel, but the vast majority will stay analog until market forces or the Commission make them change.

Engineer Available


